The One Arm Bandit: Back in the Arena for the 2011 Ellensburg Rodeo

The One Arm Bandit, John Payne, will be back in Ellensburg for the 2011 Rodeo during Labor Day weekend. A huge hit with the Ellensburg Rodeo fans, Payne has been a 10 time PRCA "Specialty Act of the Year" and has headlined the most wanted specialty act list since 1988.

With the crack of his bullwhip and help from his trained dogs, Payne herds wild animals, including buffalo and longhorns, over a narrow plank to the top of his trailer.

His single-handed performances entertain rodeo audiences all around the country. Payne has performed at the Ellensburg Rodeo a number of times, and the Ellensburg Rodeo is excited to have the One Arm Bandit in the Rodeo arena again this year.

Payne was born in Oklahoma in April of 1953. Twenty years later, Payne quickly learned that he wasn't a good electrician. On June 12, 1973, Payne climbed up a telephone pole to cut some wires.



He thought the electricity was shut off, but as 7,200 volts of electricity ran through his body for 20 seconds, he was quickly proven wrong.

The voltage burned through his left leg leaving his bone exposed, and he couldn't focus his eyes. The doctors wanted to amputate his left leg, but Payne refused. He told the doctors "I can't ride a horse with no leg; and if I can't ride a horse I don't want to live." The doctors did amputate his right arm because it had been damaged beyond repair from the voltage, naming John Payne the "One Arm Bandit."

New Bareback Arena Record Set at Last Year's Rodeo

Steven Peebles currently holds the bareback Ellensburg arena record with a 90-point ride on Calgary Stampede's Mad Money. The last record was held since 2006 by Jess Davis with an 89-point ride. Steven Peebles broke the record on Monday, September 6, 2010. He won over \$8,800 from his average and round 2 scores, and an additional \$4,500 went to both Steven Peebles and Calgary Stampede for breaking the bareback Ellensburg Rodeo arena record.

Big Four Accumulative Award of \$5,000 Goes to Trevor Brazile

The Big Four is comprised of the Ellensburg Rodeo and Walla Walla Frontier Days staged on Labor Day weekend, the Lewiston Round-up help the following weekend, and the Pendleton Round-up held the second full week of September.

In 1954, the Big Four started discussing a cash prize for the cowboy winning the most points at the four rodeos. The prize would recognize the rodeos' historical relationship, confirm their status among the nation's premier rodeos, provide an incentive for cowboys to enter

all the Big Four rodeos and reduce the number of "turn outs." Each rodeo would contribute an equal share, with the prize to be awarded at Pendleton, the last chapter in the Big Four's annual saga.

Back in the 1990's, a special award (\$5,000) was setup for the next three time winner of the Big 4 award. With Trevor Brazile winning last year, he qualifies for this special accumulative award. Others have won multiple times, but Trevor Brazile is the first to win three times since the establishment of this award.
